

2022- 2023 *Estimated* Cost of Attendance - SJD Program

The College of Law requires SJD students to spend their first academic year “Year 1” (fall and spring semesters) “in residence” at the College in Syracuse, New York. Students may then spend “Years 2-5” in Syracuse or away. Students must be enrolled full-time in at least 9 credits each semester.

*Only full-time students in Syracuse (enrolled in at least 9 credits each semester) are eligible and required to have Affordable Care Act (ACA) compliant insurance coverage during the academic year. A fee for Health Insurance will be charged to your Student Account by the University Bursar.

For students seeking to borrow U.S. government-funded financial aid, allowable types of budget adjustments may include the one-time cost of purchasing a computer or childcare expenses, and the cost to purchase health insurance. Additional expenses must be approved by the College of Law Financial Aid Office with the proper documentation.

Expenses NOT allowed in the educational budget include costs of moving, payment of consumer debt, the purchase or upkeep of an automobile, costs associated with finding employment, and expenses incurred during periods of non-enrollment. Students bringing dependents should anticipate an additional cost of \$9,500 per semester for each dependent.

Figures 1-4 represent estimated tuition and fees in full-time study. **Figure 5** represents a required, but waiveable, charge for student health insurance. **Figures 6 through 10** may vary from student to student.

All costs above are expected to be confirmed each Spring semester per University policy and may differ slightly from above.
