In accordance with Andrew Gordon's message below, effective Tuesday, March 17, and through to March 30, only essential staff and faculty should report to Dineen Hall.

As of Tuesday, March 17, and until further notice, for the purposes of this guidance, **all College of Law faculty are deemed non-essential with the exception of only those faculty members who cannot otherwise continue to teach their courses without making use of their office.** In other words, if in order to teach online, you must do so from your office in Dineen Hall using the equipment in that office, then you are essential for the time being and may come to campus for the purpose of teaching. **This guidance can only be for the time being, barring any additional prohibitions.** Please do anticipate the potential need to stay away from Dineen Hall entirely and how you would adjust.

As of tomorrow morning, **Dineen Hall exterior doors will be locked, and access to Dineen Hall will be restricted** to College of Law students, staff and faculty. Please be sure to have your **access key** with you at all times.

Please know that we are assembling all of the **feedback** and suggestions you have been sharing with me and LawPreparedness about your online teaching experience Thursday and Friday. Many thanks. We are also receiving feedback from students. We will announce and implement adjustments based on your comments this week, well in time for the return to class on March 23.
