As you know, the University is facing the challenge of re-opening campus in the fall in compliance with social distancing and other health guidelines designed to minimize the spread of COVID-19. The College of Law continues to assess the extent to which we can include residential instruction for some or all of our students this fall.

However, even with implementation of some residential components, all of our courses must be made available online to accommodate both students and faculty who may be immuno-compromised, in self-quarantine, or ill with COVID-19.
