2020– 2021 Part-Time Law Student Estimated Cost of Attendance

The College of Law provides an estimate of the costs that are reasonable for a student to attend Syracuse University College of Law and pursue the J.D. degree program. Figures 1 - 4 (below) represent estimated tuition and fees for a law student engaged in part-time study (shown here at ten credits per semester) for the 2020-2021 academic year.

Figures within the budget categories 5 - 10 (below) may vary from student to student. These variations are acceptable as long as they do not exceed the estimated maximum of \$68,340. For figures 5 through 10, please take into account all of your actual and expected expenses for one nine-month academic year of study, which extends from August 2020 through May 2021.

Additional expenses must be approved by the College of Law Financial Aid Office with the proper documentation. Allowable types of budget adjustments may include the one-time cost of purchasing a computer or child care expenses.

Expenses NOT allowed in the educational budget include costs of moving, payment of consumer debt (such as credit card payments), the purchase or upkeep of an automobile, costs associated with finding employment (interview expenses, clothing), and expenses incurred during periods of non-enrollment (i.e. summer).
