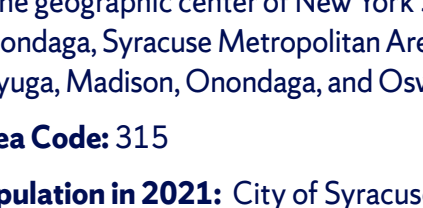


WELCOME TO SYRACUSE

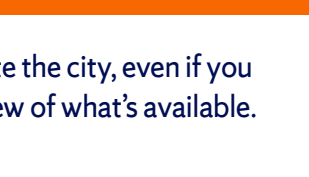

TRANSPORTATION

There are many options to navigate the city, even if you don't have a car. Here is an overview of what's available.

Airport

The newly renovated Syracuse Hancock International Airport is a 10-15 minute drive from Syracuse University. **For information visit syrairport.org**

Amtrak & Greyhound

The city's train and bus hub is a 10-minute drive from campus and connects students to vibrant cities in the northeast such as Washington, DC, Philadelphia, New York, and Boston.

Buses

CENTRO buses provide transportation for Syracuse and the surrounding suburbs. The area's inter-city bus lines, which provide service for most areas throughout Onondaga and Oswego counties, include Oswego Motor Lines, Onondaga Coach, Greyhound, and Trailways.

Connective Corridor

The Connective Corridor Bus is a free loop bus service between University Hill and downtown Syracuse, linking to central business districts and neighborhoods, and connecting to an arts and cultural district featuring more than 30 venues. It represents the largest new civic infrastructure investment in the City of Syracuse in many decades, creating new pedestrian pathways, streetscapes, green infrastructure, bikeways, redesigned public spaces, and public art.

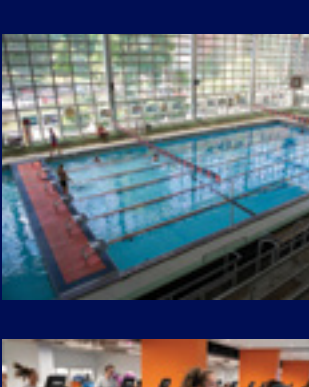
